

Vauxhall Primary School Premium Sports Expenditure Report 2017/18

Context of School

Vauxhall Primary School is smaller than average. The vast majority of pupils come from families with high levels of deprivation. The school is placed within the upper quartile in the Benchmarking and Statistical Families for Lambeth Schools, with a deprivation index of 3.8, placing the school in the top 25% of Lambeth schools with the highest levels of disadvantage. The school's deprivation indicator is also significantly higher than the national average.

The number of pupils entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) is 57.89% higher than the national average. The number of EHC pupils is significantly above national average. However, the number of SEN support pupils is 1% lower than the national average.

The vast majority of our pupils, 71.3%, has English as an additional language. An overwhelming majority of the school roll, 94%, come from minority ethnic groups. Almost half of the school population come from Black or Black British African Ethnic groups, followed by children from Black Caribbean backgrounds. There is also a growing number of Spanish children in school.

Mobility is slightly higher than the national average as some pupils join and leave other than the usual times. It is in line with the Lambeth Average

Data shows that the school population is changing and growing over time, with an increasing number of FSM, pupils from minority ethnic group and a continuously growing number of children with English as a second language.
